Trades 2 Carpenter



There's one individual who comes to mind when thinking of a woman that is a positive role model and sets a benchmark for public works professionals to strive for: Niki Trotter, Trades 2 Carpenter, City of Richmond.

Her Story

Niki graduated from the BCIT Joinery (Cabinetmaker) Program in 2002 and completed a four-year Red Seal apprenticeship. After working in the private industry, Niki and a school friend started a local business called HandyGals and successfully ran the popular local business for ten years. HandyGals provided many services including project management, kitchen and bathroom renovations, carpentry, interior painting and colour consultations. The HandyGals were returning guests on the W Network's *The Shopping Bags* where they tested featured products such as cordless drills, tool kits and cuticle creams and provided their opinions.

To the City's great fortune, Niki decided to hang up her small business hat and join the City of Richmond on May 6, 2014, making her the first and only female carpenter in Public Works. Initially there were some concerns about hiring a female into a maledominated shop, but Niki quickly alleviated such concerns and since then has been an inspirational mentor who makes visions into reality and reminds us every day that "there are no such things as problems, only solutions."

When speaking with Niki's colleagues, the common characteristics that were consistently used to describe her were: dedicated, hardworking, caring, inclusive, encouraging, humble, optimistic and an involved employee who is continually looking at ways to improve the workplace for all.

Her Influence and Involvement

Niki is the voice, the mentor and the representative for women in the Operations Yard. She chairs the women's committee for CUPE 394, a group that meets to discuss issues that may impact the female workforce and has recently campaigned to update the women's change room space. She has actively participated in the long overdue renovation and negotiated the needs brought forward by the other female staff with the facility coordinator. In true Niki fashion, she considers every small detail from the pre-construction to the finishing touches such as personalizing lockers for each female.

Niki has initiated significant changes within the Carpentry Shop as well, including lunchroom and shop improvements, positive change in moral and increased staff engagement. She has done everything from organizing breakfasts, making birthday cakes, and using humour and creativity to motivate one another.

As a carpenter, Niki works closely with all City of Richmond departments. She provides excellent customer service and helps project managers design and plan their spaces, while working within their timelines. Customers appreciate that Niki is very thorough and quick to suggest cost effective solutions or re-purposing alternatives that are less wasteful. Niki works hard on all of her projects and is well liked by everyone she encounters.

Management recognized Niki's leadership strengths and positive attitude and was selected to be one of five Public Works staff to present at our annual Engineering & Public Works Goals and Accomplishments event in March. She worked collaboratively with the other staff to write and film a short video about Public Works' daily role in the community. She was recently selected this year to participate on the 2019 Goals & Accomplishments organizing committee.

Public Works Open House is an annual event that is hosted by 220 staff volunteers on a Saturday in May and is attended by over 5,000 Richmond residents. This interactive event is an opportunity to publicly acknowledge and showcase the variety of services and talents within the Engineering and Public Works department.

Along with being a lead committee member, Niki coordinates and champions the Roads and Construction Services exhibits, making it the largest departmental contributor at the event. In 2018, Niki introduced a new booth, Kidstruction, that targeted preschool aged children and introduced them to the world of Public Works. Every year, she works with the Sign Shop and oversees the signage installation for the entire event. Since joining the committee, she has contributed many new ideas, introduced new booths, engaged many staff and encouraged them to volunteer at the event, and has been a pinnacle change to the overall success of the event.

Niki participates in the annual nationwide Take Our Kids to Work Day, a program for employee's children in grade 9 to see potential job opportunities at the City or Richmond. Similarly, she leads a section of Works on Wheels (WOW), a one-day Public Works bus tour for elementary aged children. Niki is a natural fit for these two programs as she is able to act as a role model and encourage young women to pursue Public Works as a profession.

Her Pastimes


