

THE POSITION

The District of Hudson's Hope is accepting applications for the position of Director of Public Works and Engineering. This is a permanent full-time position, reporting to the Chief Administrative Officer. The successful individual will lead the Public Works Team. They must have demonstrated expertise in water, sewer, facilities, road design, and will oversee significant renewal and growth projects. The individual will supervise, coach, lead, and mentor staff, as well as prepare, administer, and report on operating and capital budgets and 5-year plans. The Director will develop reports to present to Council and the public when required. The Director may provide technical and environmental advice and Public Work services to other department managers at their request. The ability to communicate and coordinate with internal and external stakeholders is a requirement.

INNOVATION, CREATIVITY & COMMUNICATIONS

A strong communicator, you will have started to hone your public relations skills, your understanding of the needs of the public and elected officials and you are an innovative thinker. You will have the capability to set and manage budgets and resources, perform practical problem-solving, and work effectively with staff in a unionized environment. Your developed technical input will assist in developing policy and strategic plans, perform issues resolution and attend Council meetings. The ability to work effectively, efficiently and perform well under pressure while dealing with contentious matters, you must maintain strong attention to detail.

THE WORK

With a proposed \$3.5 m operating budget and \$10 m capital budget, the new Director will be leading significant growth and renewal. Overseeing a diverse and dedicated staff, the work within the public works and engineering department is both challenging and rewarding. While a small community, the department manages a significant array of infrastructure and amenities. With a new state of the art water treatment facility being commissioned, the new Director will oversee the efficient operation and maintenance with its dedicated department operators.

- Demonstrated ability to lead and supervise EOCP-certified personnel and maintain operational and regulatory accountability on behalf of the municipality.



Nestled along the banks of the Peace River in Northeastern British Columbia, Hudson's Hope is a hidden gem rich in history, natural beauty, and community spirit.

This small rural town of approximately 1,000 residents offers the best of both worlds: the tranquility of nature and the convenience of being just 80 km from Fort St. John—a major centre in the Peace region —and a short distance from Grand Prairie.

One of the town's most notable landmarks is the W.A.C. Bennett Dam and G.M. Shrum Generating Station—one of the largest earth-filled dams in the world. Spanning two kilometres across the Peace River, it created Williston Lake, B.C.'s largest reservoir, which covers an impressive 410,000 acres.

Dinosaurs, Pristine Waters and Lattes.

The area is internationally renowned for its wealth of fossils and dinosaur footprints, offering a fascinating glimpse into prehistoric times. Surrounded by pristine lakes, rivers, and wilderness, Hudson's Hope is a paradise for outdoor enthusiasts. Locals and visitors alike enjoy fishing, boating, ATVing, water skiing, canoeing, hunting, camping, hiking, swimming, sailing, and wildlife viewing. Bald eagles, in particular, are a common sight and can be spotted year-round.
